

KEY PHASE-OUT DATES FOR THE EMERGENCY UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION PROGRAM (EUC08), FEDERAL ADDITIONAL COMPENSATION (FAC) AND EXTENDED BENEFITS (EB)

On July 22, 2010, President Obama signed Public Law 111-205, the Unemployment Compensation Extension Act of 2010. The law extended EUC08 benefits for weeks of unemployment ending on or before November 30, 2010. If an extension of EUC08 is not enacted by November 30th, the following dates provide important phase-out criteria for the program. Key Phase-Out Dates

November 20, 2010

- A worker must exhaust their regular state benefits by this date in order to enter the first tier of EUC08.

November 27, 2010

- A worker must exhaust their first, second, or third tier of EUC08 by this date in order to move to the next tier. After this date, a worker cannot move into another tier.
- Workers may continue to receive EUC08 payments during a phase-out period; no EUC08 payments can be made for weeks of unemployment beginning after April 30, 2011.

December 1, 2010

- The statutory end date for 100 percent Federal funding of most EB costs is December 1, 2010.
- The Federal government will continue to pay 100 percent of EB costs for claimants who established EB eligibility before December 1, 2010, **provided the state remains triggered on EB, through weeks of unemployment ending before May 1, 2011.**
- 26 states amended their EB laws to provide for a temporary TUR trigger contingent upon 100 percent Federal funding of EB. As a result, these 26 states will trigger off EB and no EB will be payable in these states. **No EB payments can be made during a phase-out period after a state triggers off EB and an EB period ends.** To find the date that EB periods will end in specific states, please see the "Extended Benefits Trigger Notice" at http://www.oui.doleta.gov/unemploy/claims_arch.asp

December 7, 2010

- Federal Additional Compensation (FAC) is no longer payable for workers who were in the program by June 2, 2010. This means that in states with a Saturday week-ending date, the last date that FAC is payable is the week ending December 11, 2010.
